

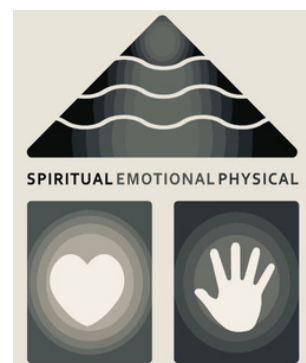

Featured articles

Tracy CCC's Navigation Center

Serving the homeless with case management and connection to services every day, is also a place where other organizations servicing the homeless can also provide their services. We use our conference room to meet with our strategic partners to address the issues of homelessness. By coordinating resources we are able to prevent duplication of services and produce more effective responses.



We regularly meet with state, county and city officials, non-profit organizations, medical service providers, faith based organizations, corporate sponsors, local business leaders and volunteers.

Food Distribution

This orchestrated effort ensured that 5,300 families received over 195,000 pounds of food without conditions. It was important to us to provide a source of food without having the recipients prove need. For many it was a humbling experience to have to receive help for the first time in their lives. We wanted to provide this help in the most gracious and dignified way possible.

Tracy House

Taking in homeless women, since October of 2020 this Tracy CCC women's congregate living home continues to provide permanent housing for up to ten women.



Outreach Team

In the spring of 2021 we established a street outreach team which serves as our organization's boots on the ground. This team serves as a liaison between our organization, code enforcement and other service providers and the homeless population. Whenever possible we have hired Outreach Team workers from within the homeless population.

Warming Center

In the fall of 2021 TCCC applied for and was awarded the contract to operate the City of Tracy's Warming Center. Though a collaborative partnership with Good Shepherd Community Church we are able to provide the homeless and those at risk a safe and warm place to weather cold winter nights between 7 PM and 7 AM through the end of March.
