A Success Story...

A woman (we'll call her "L") was on the waiting list for low-income housing development in Tracy for 2 years. During that time "L" moved out of state to live with relatives. One day last month she received notification from the housing development that a unit was now available tot her. So she packed up her family and all their belongings and came back to California. When "L" arrived, she was told that she was #30 on the waiting list and it could be up to a couple years longer before she could move in. "L" came to Tracy CCC for help because she had nothing—no friends, family, money or home. Tracy CCC provided 3 nights at a motel, then got her into a family shelter. Recently the woman called to say she found an apartment in Lodi, where a relative agreed to co-sign, and "L" had \$500 saved out of the \$950 deposit she needed to move in. Tracy CCC paid the remaining \$450 to the landlord and the woman and her family moved in on July 25th.
