



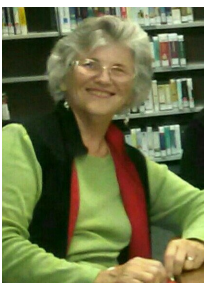
Mission

Outcomes July-December 2019



HOUSING OUTCOMES

- In the second half of 2019 Tracy CCC helped:
- 51 individuals find emergency shelter
 - 88 were placed into transitional housing
 - 49 obtained permanent housing

SHOWERS (and More!)

In the last 6 months of 2019 Tracy CCC provided:

- 611 showers for 160 individuals (unduplicated) at our Mobile Shower Unit
- 699 Hygiene Products for 232 individuals
- 159 loads of Laundry for 73 individuals



INDIVIDUALS HELPED

- July thru December 2019, Tracy CCC served:
- 167 new adult clients
 - 54 existing clients (unduplicated)

CASE MANAGEMENT

- In the second half of 2019 Tracy CCC assisted:
- 266 referrals for basic needs; of these,
 - 49 individuals enrolled in income assistance
 - 58 referred to mental health/social services



Note from the Editor

Fall was a busy time for Tracy CCC, as you can see from our Impact Report (above) covering July thru December. We served three times more **new** clients during this time than in the first 6 months of the year, which indicates the increasing need for assistance for the unsheltered.
